



## ACHIEVEMENTS 2016

- > **Antitrust compliance workshop – “Complying to Compete”, 29 February, Calgary**  
ICC, the Canadian Competition Bureau, and Blakes organized an interactive workshop hosted by Blakes on how to develop and implement an effective antitrust compliance programme using the ICC Antitrust Compliance Toolkit and its SME version as well as the Bureau’s Compliance Bulletin as references.
- > **8<sup>th</sup> Annual ICC Roundtable on Competition Policy, 27 April, Singapore**  
Held in conjunction with the ICN annual conference and in collaboration with the World Bank Group, the ICC Roundtable on Competition Policy focused on “Antitrust Compliance and Enforcement in the South-East Asian Region”. Last year’s event marked the launch of the ICC Competition Commission’s new initiatives: the First Edition of the ICC Leniency Manual and the ICC Proposal to the International Competition Network for a One-Stop-Shop for Leniency Markers.
- > **The ICC Leniency Manual – a user-guide for filing leniency applications worldwide, 27 April, Singapore**  
This is the first publication of the ICC Task Force on Cartels and Leniency. The Manual aims to demystify the leniency application process and assist businesses with filing local or multi-jurisdictional applications and gathers in the [First Edition](#) leniency practices from over 20 countries.
- > **ICC Proposal to the International Competition Network for a One-Stop-Shop for Leniency Markers, 27 April, Singapore**  
In a continued effort to enhance the dialogue with international organizations and inter-governmental bodies on the creation of an efficient system for reporting cartel behavior while preserving incentives to enter into leniency programmes in multiple jurisdictions, the ICC Task Force on Cartels and Leniency issued the ICC [Proposal](#) to the International Competition Network for a One-Stop-Shop for Leniency Markers.
- > **ICC Commission on Competition Meeting, 25 July, Paris**  
Following the outcome of the 23 June referendum on Brexit, the ICC Commission on Competition centered a commission meeting around the Brexit and its impact on competition law enforcement. Keynote speakers Chris Southworth, Secretary General of ICC UK and Michel Petite, of Counsel, Clifford Chance Brussels and former legal advisor to the EC gave an expert presentation from the UK and EU perspective respectively.



- > **ICC Antitrust Compliance Toolkit now available in Turkish and Ukrainian**  
ICC Turkey and ICC Ukraine published the Turkish and Ukrainian version of the ICC Antitrust Compliance Toolkit while the ICC International Secretariat and ICC France released the French translation of the ICC SME Toolkit. - > **Annual ICC/DG COMP meeting, 7 December, Brussels**  
The ICC Commission on Competition had a fruitful exchange with DG COMP on areas of collaboration between the two organizations, in particular antitrust compliance and advocacy, merger control, and cartels and leniency. ICC and DG COMP have agreed to have *ad hoc* meetings throughout the year to deepen the dialogue on issues of mutual interest.
